34th Annual Sportsmen's Holiday June 7th thru June 10th, Wildwood, New Jersey

Fellow Sportsmen, as this article is being published, we are six months from our 34th Annual Sportsmen's Holiday to Wildwood, NJ.

The usual suspects will again coordinate arrangements and include myself, John Kunkel, Ed Charrette, Dick Champagne and Tony Barzydlo. All payments, unless otherwise noted, will go through myself or John Kunkel and include all charges associated with Golf.

Here are the rules of the road once again. I try to be understanding as best I can but as I age; my sense of humor sometimes abandons me so here goes.

- If you think I'm psychic and know who you expect to room with or who might be in your golf foursomes, forget that immediately please. As you make payments, please note who it is you expect to share your room and with whom you expect to be playing golf. Again, only current members or those in process of becoming a member of Lodge #265 are invited to attend. Non-members that have attended previously are welcome to join us once again.

- The Aztec Motel, rooms at the Safari Motel and any additional rooms required are already arranged. We had 83 attendees last year and 62 golfers. Foursomes are limited to a total of 72 golfers so don't procrastinate as you make your deposits. Snooze and you may lose! Also, once you sign-up for golf the charge to you remains; if you can't play as scheduled for ANY reason the golf fee will not be refunded as the Elks is charged for the number of golfers scheduled to play.

- Room charges remain the same as last year; that is \$320 per person double occupancy and \$425 for a single room. We believe golf will remain the same at \$118 per golfer for Friday and Saturday but that will become final once Ed Charrette speaks with the Avalon Golf Club as the season opening approaches.

- All transportation to Wildwood will be the responsibility of participating members. Any member with a van, pick-up or extra space in their trunk is asked to step up and offer to take any overflow of clubs or luggage.

A deposit of \$100 is expected no later than Saturday, March 17th, which should be fairly easy to remember as it is St Patrick's Day


Last year we had about 40 participants elect to go a day earlier. If you choose to go on Wednesday, the room charge is \$50 that you can split with your roommate or pay yourself if there is no room mate. This is the only charge that will be settled individually with Adam at the Aztec Motel. Don't pay me. If you go on Wednesday, there will be an additional \$35 charge to be paid to me for food and beverage enjoyed on Wednesday in fairness to those who don't come until Thursday. I need to know in advance if you expect to go Wednesday to advise Adam at the motel(s).

We've enjoyed a great run with this event and I would like to keep it going as long as interest remains at current levels. It's a great deal and a memorable weekend. Please check the expected charges carefully as you make your deposit(s). I have no desire to become a personal accountant. I also have no inclination to chase anybody; you are in or you are out. No personal invitations will be issued. Payments are to be made by check only. No cash should ever be left at the bar and neither I nor the Lodge will be held accountable for cash payments should they go missing.
