We are approximately 4 months from our 40th excursion to Wildwood, N.J. and the Attache Motel. Here is the basic information you will need to sign up for participation.

We are happy to report the price structure will not change from last year. The cost for a doubleoccupied room will remain at \$425. A single room again will be \$475. If you elect to go on Wednesday, May 29th, the room charge for the extra day will be \$95 to be split according to your choice of occupancy. This will be paid directly to the Attache upon **your** arrival. The food and beverage charge for the additional day is \$45 to be included in your check to Elks Lodge #265 together with the charges for your room and golf.

Golf fees remain at \$105 per day or \$210 for the 2-day golf tournament. Once you sign up for golf, there will be no refunds for any reason even if you elect not to play as scheduled. The Elks is charged for the days and players we commit to the Avalon Country Club. Charges for golf have not changed since last year.

Last **year** we had 83 guys sign up for the trip. It has been a great run and we hope your continued interest remains. A lot of time, effort and planning go into this event every year and is apparently worthwhile for participants and our Lodge. As before, a mandatory sign-up sheet will be available spelling out your room occupancy choices, roommates, golf days and partner selections. As in the past deposit due by March 17th. Final payments are due by Friday May 10th back to the Lodge or directly to John Kunkel. Please take the time to complete the sign-up sheet for the sake of clarity and accounting. It is time consuming following up on errors and omissions; we are not mind readers. All questions should be directed to John Kunkel. The **bar** staff is not involved in planning, pricing, golf, or room assignments.
