I would like to remind all of you of our great history and tradition. The Elks are a distinctly American fraternal order and **Flag Day** is one of our most important traditions, dating back to the 1908 National Convention in Dallas, Texas. The Grand Lodge voted on instituting Flag Day as a mandatory national ritual for all Lodges. This prompted President Woodrow Wilson, an Elk himself, to recognize the Order's observance of Flag Day, and in 1916 he issued a proclamation that officially established June 14th as a national holiday.

The week of June 14th is designated as "National Flag Week." During National Flag Week, the president will issue a proclamation "urging the people to observe the day as the anniversary of the adoption on June 14, 1777, by the Continental Congress of the Stars and Stripes as the official flag of the United States of America."

On June 18, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. We will celebrate Flag Day at our Lodge. After the flag ceremony in front o the Lodge, we will adjourn to the lodge room to perform the Flag Day ritual. At this ceremony, we will present a flag that was flown over our nation's capital to the Wolcott Volunteer Fire Department to recognized their contributions to the Wolcott community. Please join us in celebrating this joyous occasion.

Family Picnic 2022







37th Annual Sportsmen's Holiday

June 9th-June 12th, 2022, Wildwood, New Jersey

Fellow Sportsmen, as this article is being published, we are less than 2 weeks from our 37th Annual Sportsmen's' Holiday trip to Wildwood,NJ. The usual suspects will coordinate arrangements and include me, John Kunkel, and Kenny Dupont. All payments, including golf charges, unless otherwise noted, will go through John Kunkel or Kenny Dupont. We try to be understanding, but need clarity early on, so here are the rules:

- There is a sign-up sheet to be completed. Complete the form in its entirety and submit it with your down payment. Please indicate your room partner and golf foursome.
- This year's dates are the same as the New Jersey American Legion Convention in Wildwood. Our host and fellow Lodge member, Adamo Pepitone, can only commit to us the Attache Motel, which can accommodate 80 people. He will do his level best to scrounge up additional rooms if required, but all other motels are already fully booked; consequently, I can only guarantee 80 people.
- In fairness to all, selections will be made in accordance with receipt of payment, which we will start taking immediately. Don't think about this until the last minute or you will not be included. Last year we had fewer guys sign up due to Covid; however, we are expecting a larger group this year, so please don't wait until the last minute to show your interest.
- Room charges and golf fees have gone up. The room fees are \$380 for a double and \$440 for a single. The golf fee for the 2-day tournament is \$160 and should be paid when you make payment for your room. If you sign-up for golf and decide not to play for any reason, **the golf fee is not refundable**. We are charged by Avalon for the number of golfers we submit, and the charge remains whether or not you play.
- All transportation to Wildwood is the responsibility of participating members. Any member with a van, pick-up or extra space in his trunk is asked to step up and offer to take any overflow of clubs and luggage.
- A \$100 deposit or payment in full is expected as soon as you receive this article. Again, I can only guarantee rooms for 80 people at the Attache Motel. The sooner I know the level of interest, the sooner I can advise Adamo to work on securing additional rooms.
- In previous years, many of the guys elected to go down on Wednesday. If you wish to do this, there is an additional charge of \$85 for a single or double occupancy room. This charge is paid directly to the Attache Motel when you arrive and is not included in the charges payable to the Elks Lodge. Also, there will be a \$35 charge for beverages and food on Wednesday.

We've enjoyed a great run with this event and would like to keep it going as long as interest remains at current levels. It's a great deal and a memorable weekend. We have no desire to become personal accountants, so please keep track of your payments and balance due. We also have no inclination to chase anybody; you are in or you are out. Payments are to be made by check only. No cash should ever be left at the bar and neither the committee members nor the Lodge will be held accountable for cash payments should they go missing.

Payment in full will be expected by Friday, May 6, 2022.
